In exercise of the power conferred under section 32, 33, 34(2)(d) & (h) of the Assam Forest Regulation, 1891 and its amendments, the Governor of Assam is pleased to publish the following Schedule of Rates of Royalty leviable on all classes of Forest Produce in Assam.

The Governor of Assam is further pleased to revise the rates of royalty on sand and stone, gravel and shingles etc. payable by certain Department of the State and Central Govt. viz. PWD, Irrigation, Flood Control, CPWD, Defence Department, Railways, Municipal Corporation, Town Committee, Town Planning, PHE, Development Blocks, BRTF and Assam Police Housing Corporation for undertaking works within the State.

This supersedes all previous Govt. Notifications issued in this regard and comes into force with effect from the issue of this Notification and shall remain valid until further order.

The cubic contents of the logs will be calculated by multiplying the square of the quarter girth taken at the middle of the logs multiplied by the length of the logs. But for the logs above, 3.65 meter in length the girth will be measured at 1.83 meter from the butt end of the logs.

The above rates are for girth measurement taken over bark. For barked logs and dressed logs, the rates will be 10(ten) percent and 33(thirty-three) percent higher respectively than the rates for logs measured over bark mentioned in the above column of girth 1.22m and above.

The rates for sawn timber shall be 150% (one hundred fifty percent) of the rate mentioned in the column "girth 1.22m and above" irrespective of the girth of the logs from which the sawn timber has been converted.

[Note: - For fixing the rate of sawn timber, the decision of High Power Committee, Govt. of India fixing the minimum of outturn at 75% per cu.m. on conversion from log form has been taken into consideration]

Firewood is defined as wood under 0.60 mt. in length and up to 0.45 mt in girth. Unsuitable wood of higher dimension, if found owing to hollowness, crooked or other defects for sawing and plane may be removed as firewood after splitting.

17. ADVALORUM RATES OF ROYALTY:

All other minor forest produce not listed above such as Bee-wax, Honey, Ivory, Chaulmugra, Lac, all medicinal plants, Bhat-ghila (*Oroxylum*) barks, etc. will be charged at 12½ percent Advalorum as fixed by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Assam for all Forests including land at the disposal of the Govt. of Assam.

Advalorum Rates of Royalty will be notified on 1st of April each year from the office of the Forest Utilization Officer, Assam with prior approval of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Assam.

18. BASE PRICE FOR AUCTION SALE:

The "Base Price" for Auction Sale of any timber is to be fixed in proportion to the AVERAGE of the SALE VALUE of the last 3 (Three) consecutive Auction Sale of the same category of timber.

19. LEVY OF VALUE ADDED TAX, INCOME TAX ETC:

Value Added Tax, Income tax etc. at the rates prevalent will be leviable on payment of royalty for any kind of forest produce operated under permit only.

20. THE GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE ISSUE OF PERMITS OF SAND, STONE ETC. FOR THE DEPARTMENTS/ UNDERTAKINGS OF THE STATE & THE CENTRAL GOVT. ARE SHOWN BELOW:

A. Rates of Royalty on Forest Produce:

1) Sand	Rs. 90/- per cu.m
2) Boulder/Stone/Gravel/Broken Stone/Shingle	Rs. 130/- per cu.m
3) Earth/Clay	Rs. 15/-per cu.m
4) River Silt	Rs. 5/-

B. 1) Entitled Departments/Undertakings of the State and the Central Govt., shall obtain Permits for the above materials from the Forest Department on prior payment of Royalty etc. The above rate is exclusive of VAT, Income Tax which will be realised as per prevalent rates.

2) From now onwards the concerned Department/Undertaking will write to the respective Divisional Forest Officer recommending the names of Contractors/Agency for issuance of permit against the concerned departmental job along with the copies of estimate.

3) Informations required to be furnished by the Indenting Department are as follows:

- a) Name of the job and place of use.
- b) Time allowed for the job
- c) Name of the contractors.
- d) The quantity recommended.
- e) Name of the quarry.
- f) Copy of the estimate.

- 4) The respective Divisional Forest Officer shall issue the permit only on receipt of the above informations.
- 5) No permit shall be issued in favour of any Contractor/Agency directly unless the respective Department/Undertaking, for whom forest produce is required, authorizes the Contractor/Agency.
- 6) The authorized Contractor/Agency shall submit their bills to the respective authority of the Department/Undertaking by whom they are engaged in the job.
- 7) The respective Department/Undertaking on receipt of the bill from Contractor/Agency will inform concerned Divisional Forest Officer with reference to his letter at Para (2) above, about the quantity billed for and requests the Divisional Forest Officer to confirm the quantity lifted.
- 8) The Divisional Forest Officer on receipt of the letter shall report to the concerned Department/Undertaking about the quantity collected and if there be any difference in the quantity collected and billed for, the Divisional Forest Officer will submit bills imposing up to 200 percent monopoly fee for the difference and the concerned Department/Undertaking will realize the amount from the Contractor's/Agency's bill and credit the amount to the concerned Divisional Forest Officers as Forest Revenue.
- 9) The concerned Department/Undertaking while issuing any Tender Notice should insert a clause in the said Notice that forest produce required by the Department/Undertaking will be made available at the rates as applicable.
- 10) This rate is applicable only for utilization of forest produce within the State of Assam.
- 11) All Govt. Departments/Undertakings including Corporate bodies shall obtain permit from Forest Department only for their requirement on full payment of Forest Royalty etc. in advance.
- 12) The Forest Department shall have the right to modify the Rates of Royalty at any time or stop issue of permit without any prior intimation.


